### Raytheon Anschütz and Wärtsilä signed supply agreement

**The German navigation system supplier Raytheon Anschütz has signed a new agreement with Wärtsilä Corporation, Finland, the marine industry's leading ship power integrator. According to the new agreement, Raytheon Anschütz will supply their Integrated Bridge Systems for Wärtsilä's total ship system solutions.**
